
## MAKE A STYLISH HOUSE NUMBER



Your house's number is way more than just a utilitarian marker for the pizza delivery man to find you. It can be a personal statement if you get a bit creative with it. This is a project that will improve your curb appeal and extend your design taste to one of the most overlooked details in home design.



## **STEPS**

- Determine what size your house number should be. Consider readability from the street and how it looks in proportion to the other elements around it.
- Cut the background board to length using the Versacut Compact Circular Saw.
- 3 Draw your numbers on a second board. Design your own, or use a font from your computer. With the board clamped securely to the Pegasus, and the Axis Recip/Jigsaw in jigsaw mode, cut out the numbers.
- 4 Sand all of the surfaces, edges and corners using the 20V Oscillating Multi-Tool and the included sanding pad attachment. Wipe the sanded surface with a damp rag to remove any sawdust.
- 5 Stain the base board with the paint or stain color of your choice.
- 6 Paint the numbers with paint or stain color of your choice.
- 7 Use heavy-duty wood glue to adhere the numbers to the base board.
- 8 Mount the number using hardware appropriate for the structure it's attaching to.

## RECOMMENDED MATERIALS

- (1) 1" x 6 x 18" hardwood board (for backer board)
- (1) 1" x 4" x 12" hardwood board (for numbers)
- 1 qt of exterior-grade wood stain
- 1 qt of black latex paint
